



As the Rampal Thermal Power Station project started in Rampal Upazila, that area became a point of attraction for private corporations. One of the corporations, Orion Group, started using its brokers to falsely tempt and pressurize to possess the lands at a nominal price from the inhabitants. At one point, it became noticeable that the company was illegally merging the unsold lands inside their territory with barbed wires.

When the landowners tried to stop them, they harassed some of the owners, including Taslima Begum, one of the inhabitants of Rajnagar Union in Rampal Upazila. Even the family members of the landowners were threatened and harassed. They formed a group and took repeated attempts of negotiation. But did not receive any positive response from the company. Then Taslima and the group members contacted the police, land officials, and union council members and started demolishing the barbed wires on their own.

Eventually, the Orion group agreed in coming to fair terms with Taslima and bought the land from her. Finally, Taslima and her group won the battle.
